## DeSoto Parish • Louisiana

---

DeSoto is one of three parishes considered to be major centers of Greek Revival architecture in the state. Whereas other parishes average about a half dozen Greek Revival residences, DeSoto boasts at least twenty properties, not to mention four churches, a temple fronted store, and a Masonic hall in Keachi. This special heritage really represents the parish's architectural peak. There are 29 sites on the National Register of Historic Places.

### KEACHI *Places of Interest, Dining*

---

The town of Keachi was first incorporated in 1858. It was named after an Indian group that was related to the Caddo tribes. Early settlers were mainly families from other southern states moving west.
